Ron's Pharmacy Tour

On Nov. 15th, 2010, UCSD-ASCP had the special opportunity to visit and tour Ron's Pharmacy Services located in the Sorrento Valley neighborhood of San Diego. Ron's Pharmacy Services is an independently owned and operated specialty pharmacy that caters to the needs of a number of specialty care, long-term care, hospice care, and other skilled nursing facilities in the San Diego area. Ron Belville, the owner and pharmacist, graciously offered to give a tour of his facility (which is not open to the public) to a group of UCSD-ASCP students.

Upon arrival to the facility, our first impression of Ron's Pharmacy Services was that it meant business! As Dr. Belville brought us from department to department, he showed and explained the pharmacy workflow to our group. Although each department was filled with busy workers that were frantically shuffling prescriptions, medications, and records, there was an uncanny sense of organization in the chaos. Needless to say, what seemed like chaos to us was actually a very refined and polished process that has worked very well for the pharmacy.

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Hypertension Screening at Ed Brown Senior Center's 1st Annual Wellness Fair

On November 18th, UCSD-ASCP was honored to have been part of Ed Brown Senior Center's 1st Annual Wellness Fair. Nine ASCP members (Greg Estep, Traci Bricker, Trina Huynh, Michelle Lew, Christine Nguyen, Inna Sosinsky, Lily Wong, Jeffrey Yoon, and Christina Yoon) attended the event and assisted with blood pressure screening for the seniors. In addition to the screening, members also educated seniors on immunization, specifically the influenza vaccine. Each member was very enthusiastic about their interactions with the seniors; besides measuring blood pressure, each member was able to engage the seniors in conversation to counsel them regarding blood pressure management and immunizations. Although this was Ed Brown Senior Center's 1st Annual Wellness Fair, there were many seniors and more than half stopped by our booth! Thus, we were able to screen 21 patients on their blood pressure.

Managing Diabetes at the Vi Retirement Community

On November 24th, UCSD Skaggs School of Pharmacy students and ASCP members, Jessica Lau, Inna Sosinsky, Sandy Chong and Chausa Nguyen, held another educational presentation at Vi Retirement Community in La Jolla. The talk, entitled "Managing Diabetes," gave an overview of the disease and focused on the importance of nonpharmacological techniques of diet and exercise in managing blood sugar and preventing the serious complications affiliated with diabetes. The students also outlined the symptoms of hypoglycemia and treatment strategies to control low blood sugar. Twenty seniors attended the presentation and all felt that the talk helped strengthen their understanding of diabetes and gave them more confidence in managing and controlling their diabetes. We would like to thank **Sheila Caldito,** Wellness Coordinator at Vi, **and Dr. Eric Cooper,** our pharmacist preceptor, for helping make this event successful.

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
