## **UCSD-ASCP VA Tours**

This spring, ASCP members had the unique opportunity to learn more about Veterans Affairs San Diego Healthcare system through the tours held on April 9 and 23, 2013. The VA tours were made possible by the efforts of Drs. Larry Zelman (Geriatric and Nutrition Support Pharmacist) and Joe Nguyen (PGY2 Administration Resident), who helped lead the students through different parts of the hospital. The tour started off with an introductory PowerPoint about the VA, given by Dr. Joe Nguyen. This presentation provided information about the decentralized system, residency programs available as well as the

difference between inpatient, ambulatory care and pharmacy specialty positions. Drs. Catherine Hong (PGY2 Critical Care Resident) and Oska Lawrence (PGY1 Acute Care Resident) were also present to answer questions about residencies. Students on the tour were able to visit the Pharmacy supply area to see how medications are packaged into unit-dosed forms and organization of medications into the Omnicell carousel. The next stop was the Emergency Department, followed by the Intensive Care Unit. Dr. Larry Zelman led the second half of the tour, which included visiting the Community Living Center and the IV

room. He talked about his role as the Geriatric Nutrition Specialist and explained the patient population in the community living center. At the IV room, students learned about sterile IV compounding and total parenteral nutrition. These tours gave the participating students exposure to the VA San Diego system and provided more information about the role of the geriatric pharmacist. Due to the success of these new tours, UCSD-ASCP will be having more VA tours this upcoming school year!



## ASCP Participates in UCSD Senior Health Education Event (SHEE)

Every spring quarter, (May 22<sup>nd</sup>) first year student pharmacists at UCSD Skaggs School of Pharmacy reach out to seniors in the community by having presentation at a senior center. SHEE event for this year was held at the College Avenue Older Adult Center in San Diego and students presented on a wide range of health topics including Diabetes, Cholesterol, Hypertension, Vitamins, etc.

The students also performed free screenings for blood glucose and blood pressure. This year, ASCP participated in this annual health educational event to help seniors have better understanding about Medicare and Medicare Part D. UCSD SSPPS second year students Minh Nguyen and Phyo Sandi Aung presented the Medicare poster and Medicare Part D elective professor Dr.

Nathan Painter volunteered to precept the students. Current Medicare enrollees and potential Medicare eligible seniors attended the poster and presenters were able to explain the differences between Medicare Part A, B, C, and D, and how Medicare Part D plans may differ in terms of premium, copays, deductible, and drug coverage.

## Learning how to reach out to seniors: Spring Outreach Elective

2013 marks the second year that ASCP has been running the Spring Geriatric Outreach Elective. This year, seven students drew upon what they learned in the Winter Geriatric Pharmacotherapy Elective and gave outreach presentations to retirement communities in the San Diego area. Knowing pharmaceutical information is completely different from being able to teach it to a person with no prior knowledge. Students learned how to effectively communicate critical medical information to seniors by

simplifying information without diluting its quality or importance. A medication safety presentation was given at White Sands of La Jolla where seniors were taught how to use their prescription and over-the-counter medications safely and properly. At La Vida Del Mar, seniors were given a presentation on nutritional goals for patients with diabetes, hypertension, hyperlipidemia, etc. Seniors at both events were highly engaged in the presentations

and asked plenty questions showing their great interest and concern for the topics being presented. After each presentation, attendees participated in a bingo to test their knowledge and were rewarded with prizes. ASCP would like to thank Dr. Joseph Ma and Dr. Sarah McBane for overseeing the elective and presentations. We look forward to seeing how the elective will grow in the coming years!

### **VA Stand Down**

On July 12-14<sup>th</sup>, ASCP members had the unique opportunity to participate in the VA Stand Down. The students worked in conjunction with students from the CSHP and APhA UCSD chapters as well. It is a chance for veterans and their families to come and receive services such as medical, pharmacy and dental visits, as well as counseling and job placement assistance, among many other services.

This year the students were able to participate in medication counseling and blood pressure screenings for the veterans. At the medication counseling table, students were able to practice their skills that they have learned through school and explain to the patients multiple aspects of the medications, such as how to take it, any drug interactions there may be, and potential side effects. While some of the students practiced counseling, others were offering blood pressure screenings. They were able to take the blood pressure of the patients and direct them on healthy lifestyle modifications that they could make, such as dietary changes and exercise.

The event also allowed the students to work alongside pharmacists from many different hospitals, including the VA, Kaiser and Scripps. Overall, the event was a great success and having the opportunity to interact with the veterans is always a unique opportunity. It was great to be able to serve those who served us. The veterans appreciated the help we had to give and it was a great way to reach out to the San Diego community.
