On May 8, 2018, a group of P1 and P2 students visited PharMerica located in San Diego. PharMerica is a long-term care pharmacy with locations all over the United States. During the tour, we got to see the facility starting from the computer system that PharMerica uses to process prescription orders to the filling of the prescriptions to the packaging of filled prescriptions for delivery. We also got to see their newly built IV compounding room

and learn about USP regulations. From the tour and talking to the pharmacists, we were able to gain a better understanding of what a long-term care pharmacy is and what a pharmacist does in this setting. We learned that long-term care pharmacy is a mixture of community pharmacy and hospital pharmacy; long-term care pharmacists apply their clinical knowledge in making dose recommendations while filling and dispensing medication without having the direct-patient interaction component as in a community pharmacy.

Lunchtime Talk with Ms. Elliot Stirling

Ms. Ellen Stirling, a representative from the San Diego County Coalition for Improving End-of-Life Care, visited the UCSD campus on Tuesday May 29, 2018 to talk about advanced care planning in the geriatric population and provided some helpful resources. The students learned the importance of the process, which allows competent adults to guide their medical care at times when they are unable to speak for themselves. Through useful tools, such as the "Go Wish Cards", students got to sample how to bring up difficult conversations among family members regarding end-of-life care. Towards the end of the talk, the students were able to see how different values and beliefs can influence decisions for future health care goals.



Medicare Part D Brown Bag Event

On April 27, QuynhMy Nguyen and Katie Kesler participated in the Medicare Part D Brown Bag Event. The "Brown Bag" in the brown bag event symbolizes the patient's medication bag. Our purpose of this event is to do a quick medication reconciliation and check for drug-drug interactions. QuynhMy and Katie did a great job in answering questions that the patients had about their medications to their best knowledge and emphasizing important counseling points during the event. I know that all the patients who came, had left with some knowledge.

Guannan Wang said it was a fabulous experience to use the knowledge he learned from pharmacy school to educate the seniors and doing outreach at senior residence is the best way to give back to the community. Guannan stated that "This is my first time visiting a senior residence and

working with geriatric patients. I had a great time interacting with all the senior residents, and I was surprised that they actually knew more than I do about osteoarthritis. One lady who has osteoarthritis shared her medical history with us and also told us about her treatments for osteoarthritis which were not included in our presentation at all. I felt so lucky that I learned a lot from the patient about osteoarthritis as well through the outreach."

Immunizations Outreach Yvonne Yap (P2), VP of Internal Affairs

On May 22, ASCP held the last senior specific immunizations outreach for the year at St. John's Plaza. Katie Kesler and Guannan Wang discussed the importance of senior specific vaccinations to prevent diseases. They were accompanied by VP of Immunizations, Yvonne Yap, and their pharmacist preceptor, Dr. David Bao. The immunization topics covered included Shingles (Zostavax and Shingrix), pneumonia (Prevnar 13 and Pneumovax 23), flu, and tetanus. The presentation was heavily focused on the newly approved Shingles vaccine, Shingrix. Residents learned about the main differences

between the Shingrix and Zostavax vaccine. The effectiveness, route of administration, and scheduling for both vaccines were thoroughly compared. At the end of the presentation, there was a Q and A session where the residents had the chance to ask about anything they did not understand during the presentation.

On June 22nd, the Rady Summer Medical Academy Mini Pharmacy Day was held at Janssen Research and Development. Students were given the opportunity to participate in different activities that enabled them to explore the various aspects of the pharmacy profession. UCSD Skaggs School of Pharmacy students assisted with the activities which included diabetes education, where students learned how to read blood glucose levels; asthma awareness, where students were taught the proper use of an inhaler; medication safety recognition, where students were informed of the different scenarios where medication safety can be a concern; clinical pharmacy information, where students prepared IV bags; and the compounding process, where students made their own lip balm. Not only did students engage in these hands-on activities, they also had the opportunity to hear from different pharmacists regarding the various roles and responsibilities of the profession.
