Immunizations Outreach

On April 11th, Tiffany Cheng, Samantha Kim, and Eric Chen had the opportunity to present the importance of senior-specific vaccinations to the residents of St. John's Plaza in Lemon Grove, California. They were accompanied by the VP of Immunizations, Amy Hsu, and their pharmacy preceptor, Dr. Christina Mnatzaganian. The presenters emphasized the importance of receiving the shingles shot (Zostavax vaccine), to get their flu shot annually, and to follow up with their doctor about any booster shots they may need including the pneumonia and TDap vaccinations. Another point the presenters emphasized about the Zostavax vaccine was its time-sensitivity, as every year after the age of 60 reduces its effectiveness. At the end of the presentation, the floor was opened up to a questions-and-answers session in which the presenters cleared up any confusion the audience still had. The event wrapped up a successful year of immunization presentations that reached out to the residents of many senior centers.

Asian Pacific Health Foundation Health Fair

Oftentimes, the importance of finding the right Part D plan is overlooked. Seniors may not realize that each plan differs in drug coverage due to differences in premiums, deductibles, and copays. With the help of student pharmacists trained under the Medicare Part D elective held every fall quarter, seniors can potentially reduce their spending on prescription medications. Through the

Medicare Part D outreaches, pharmacy students can not only help seniors understand their medications, but also help them understand the benefits they are entitled to under Medicare.

This past spring, Medicare Part collaborated with Asian Pacific Health Foundation participating in three health fairs to help potential and current Medicare enrollees understand their benefits and answer any questions regarding their plan. At each outreach, we provided poster presentations to a broad spectrum of patients and experienced the cultural diversity in our community. The first outreach took place on April 23rd, where we assisted the Chinese population at a Sunday Church. The second health fair was on May 15th, where we assisted Vietnamese patients at the Vietnamese Federation of San Diego. Pharmacists, Dr. Binh Tran and Dr. Sandy Chong, volunteered to precept the students and provided additional information to attendees. The last event of the year was held on May 28th at the Indo-Chinese Association.

For instance, more than 90% of people think it's important to talk about their loved ones' and their own wishes for end-of-life care, yet less than 30% of people have discussed what
