Lunchtime talk with Dr. Pujji

Dr. Pujji, an experienced geriatric emergency doctor, gave us a lunch-time talk about her experiences as part of a busy emergency care team. Dr. Pujji provided for us the structure of the 4 M's on how healthcare teams evaluate a geriatric patient's visit to the hospital. Through the experiences she shared, Dr. Pujji clearly showed how her medical team specially cares for older adults in how they are assessing for specific parameters, such as fall risk or mental status. Her presentation was particularly timely in teaching us her considerations when her team addresses the impact of COVID-19 on their patients. I found this lunch-time talk valuable for my medical career in recognizing specialized needs and finding the best approach to improving the health of the geriatric population. My peers and I were inspired to continue to consider how we can improve the evaluation and care of older adult populations in the future!
