Second Annual Consultant Pharmacist Networking Session

On October 30th 2012, UCSD-ASCP held the 2nd Annual Consultant Pharmacist Networking Session. This year, 6 pharmacists participated in our event, including: former CA-ASCP President Dr. Greg Medley, Dr. Ron Belville, Dr. Francesco Mangiapane, Dr. Pam Schuster, Dr. Stephanie Matinpour and Dr. Larry Zelman. Our faculty advisors Drs. Joseph Ma and Sarah McBane attended as well.

The event started off with a brief introductory presentation about consultant pharmacists and the Certified Geriatric Pharmacist credential. This was followed by each of the pharmacists introducing themselves and describing what they do to ensure patients' medications are appropriate, effective and safe in order to optimize therapies and health outcomes. The job descriptions of the pharmacists working in the hospital, skilled nursing facility and home setting included evaluating and monitoring medication therapies as well as identifying, resolving and preventing medication-related problems. Dr. Belville is experienced in managing long term care pharmacies and was able to tell students more about the business aspect of pharmacy. Dr. Medley shared his experience of evaluating multiple healthcare systems to promote clinical pharmacy services and implement cost-effective medication use. The next part of the event included a question and answer session, where students asked the panel of pharmacists for more details about their typical work day as well as how they got to where they are today. All of the guest speakers had interesting stories to share and gave students advice about how to find their future career paths.

ASCP Medicare Part D Refresher

On Wednesday November 28th 2012, UCSD-ASCP hosted its first quarterly lunch talk of the school year with Dr. Nathan Painter, Pharm.D., CDE, as the guest speaker. Dr. Painter is the co-director of clinical pharmacy services at UCSD Family Medicine clinics and is also part of the Skaggs faculty. He is involved in teaching the pharmacy practice courses and the Medicare Part D elective.

At the lunch talk, Dr. Painter gave a presentation about Medicare Part D to pharmacy students and a handful of medical students. The presentation went over the basics of Medicare Part D and included detailed diagrams showing when the coverage gap and catastrophic coverage occurs. He also gave updates about the new drug formularies, which now cover barbiturates and have unrestricted coverage of benzodiazepines. Additionally, he pointed out that the impact of healthcare reform in recent years is leading to the gradual elimination of the coverage gap (donut hole). This is being achieved by

partial coverage of both generic and brand medications in the coverage gap as well as a reduction in the out-of-pocket amount that qualifies an enrollee for catastrophic coverage. This lunch talk was a helpful overview of Medicare Part D for students who did not take the elective before and was also a good review of the basic concepts for students who already learned about Medicare before. The ASCP executive board would like to thank Dr. Painter for his involvement with the club and for presenting this informative talk. We look forward to bringing in more guest speakers future quarters to share knowledge about geriatrics and geriatricrelated topics.
