Senior Prom Anh Nguyen (P2), President Elect



The presentation went over the key symptoms of heartburn and the three different types of over-the-counter medications used to treat heartburn including antacids, histamine-2 receptor

antagonists, and proton pump inhibitors. The students explained the physiology and causes of heart attacks and how to distinguish the symptoms from heartburn. The presentation also covered what to do in case anyone is having symptoms of a heart attack. The audience members at Brookview Village were very attentive and asked many great questions about the topic. The outreach was an overall success and we look forward to giving more presentations at Brookview Village!

On May 31st 2017, it was our pleasure to have Ms. May Bull come to our campus to give the ASCP members a talk about palliative and end-of-life issues. Ms. May Bull is a registered nurse with a lot of experiences in hospice care, and a member of San Diego County Coalition for

improving End-of-Life Care. Her talk provided insightful information about advance health care planning, which is a process aimed at allowing competent adults guide their medical care at times when they are unable to speak for themselves. She talked about "Death Cafés", and the Go Wish Game. She shared her stories about how she helped her patients make informed choices at the end of the life journey, and raised awareness about the importance of planning ahead for medical care and treatment 5 goals.

Vitamins & Minerals Presentation

On April 27th 2017, ASCP held a vitamins and minerals outreach for a group of seniors at the Vi at La Jolla Village. Presenters included Elizabeth Duxbury, Yvonne Pham, and Natalie Tran. Dr. David Bao was the preceptor for the event. The students discussed tips for taking vitamins, precautions about certain vitamins, what each is for, how much to take for each, and good sources for each vitamins and minerals. In general, the seniors were enthusiastic about the subject. Some were curious on the source of certain vitamins, and others were concerned about not getting enough or getting too much supplements. The students and Dr. Bao answered the seniors' questions by providing details explanations about sources of vitamins A, B12, C, D, calcium. Even though the event lasted only one hour, it was very successful and productive.
